It showed the Russian and American flags merging in the middle with the blue planet Earth above, floating in black space. This denoted that the Earth is our common home, where we should learn to live together if we do not wish to perish.

She got an appointment and visited the Soviet Women's Committee in Moscow. There was no wind that day but Moscow school students flew the kite June 1st, International Childrens' Day.

Thus encouraged, Jane organized an international day of kite flying for peace, October 12th. Kite clubs, worldwide, are participating. Let's do it!
