# JAPANESE KITEMAKERS PUT ON A REAL SHOW

The 188 attendees of the Fort Worden Kitemakers Conference received a real treat in March from the fantastic experience provided by the invited Japanese guests. Mr. Masaaki Modegi, Mr. Hideo Matsutani, and Mrs. Tokuko Sato conducted excellent workshops in their areas of specialty.

It was obvious from Modegi's opening presentation on Japanese kite history that the wekend would be an unparalleled opportunity to learn more about the kites of Japan. The knowledge of kites shown by Modegi and the display of various kites from different areas of Japan were fantastic. (Several pictures of the kites displayed are elsewhere in this Newsletter. -Ed.) After participating in this workshop, you had to have the urge to get to Japan to see Modegi's museum. The variety of kites was overwhelming.

Mrs. Tokuko Sato taught a very interesting class using the tsugaru dako. This kite is flown in high winds and therefore uses a heavy frame of hiba wood (similar to cypress) Class members outlined the figure on the kite with sumi ink and then painted the kites in the traditional way. For a non-painter, it was an eye-opening experience. I now have a greater appreciation of the techniques necessary to make such kites. It is also obvious

why it takes much time to be able to adequately paint a kite in the traditional way. Mrs. Sato is a very outgoing and engaging person and a great instructor.

Mr. Hideo Matsutani taught two separate sessions on the kakudako. In contrast with Mrs. Sato's class, here class members constructed the frame from pre-split and matched bamboo and Matsutani prepared all the graphics. Between sessions Matsutani could be seen sitting on the floor preparing washi for the next session. A very engaging and entertaining personality, Matsutani's skill and enthusiasm were quickly apparent.

Beyond the class sessions, Japanese culture was also presented to conference attendees on Saturday night. Mr. and Mrs. Modegi performed a small portion of a Japanese tea ceremony on the theater stage. Most Westerners have relatively little knowledge and even less appreciation for the intricacies of this ancient ceremony. Many years of study and practice

are necessary to achieve a satisfactory level of performance in this ceremony.

Following the tea ceremony was a performance by the drum group Tsunami Taiko. The intensity of sound was a marked contrast to the quiet of the tea ceremony. The Seattle group is composed of 10 youths of Japanese ancestry, ranging from 10 to 18 years of age. Theirs was a quite remarkable performance, very well executed. They raised the energy level of the standing-room-only crowd.

This years edition of the Fort Worden Kitemakers Conference gave many kitemakers a new window into a different culture. This conference will not soon be forgotten. The organizing committees did a tremendous job in 1997.

Now that the rush of income tax season is over, I can get on with really serious things like kiteflying and kitemaking, and organizing an edition of the WKA Newsletter.



#### WKA ANNUAL MEETING HELD AT FORT WORDEN

The only WKA general membership meeting of the year was held Friday night at Fort Worden. President Dave Christenson called his last meeting to order at 5:00 PM. There were 12 people in attendance, including a quorum of the Board.

A financial report from Treasurer Carol Lord was read by Dave. A note was made that the WKA is no longer receiving any grants from either the Washington State International Kite Festival or the Fort Worden Kitemakers Conference.

Tom Sisson reported that there will be a show of kites at the Pacific Science Center in Seattle during the month of April in 1998. The kites will be hung in the new wing being added to the PSC. These kites will be the first exhibit in the new Building 5A.

Sylvia Bernauer reported that WKA gained 50 new families as memberships in 1996. Most are very active in kiting. 100 members did not renew in 1996. This may have been due to lack of notification. It was proposed that WKA send notices to members nearing the end of their membership period. The renewal date for each membership is noted on the mailing label on each newsletter.

The change in officers was introduced. Mike Benedict will be the new President of WKA as Dave retires to the position of Past President, replacing Steve Millspaugh. Stu Murphy has resigned as Vice President. All other positions remain the same.
